


# Model 66 Cable Puller with 4 Wheel Mobile Carriage

### (\*\*)) IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

**A DANGER** DO NOT operate cable puller in wet or damp locations.

**A DANGER** DO NOT expose to rain.

**A DANGER** DO NOT operate in an explosive atmosphere.

**A DANGER** DO NOT use near energized circuits.

▲ WARNING DO NOT use cable puller as a hoist or for lifting, supporting or transporting people or loads. Use only for its intended purpose as a cable puller.

**A WARNING** DO NOT wrap rope around any body parts. DO NOT wrap rope around wrists. Hold rope so that it may be released quickly.

▲ WARNING ALWAYS keep rope away from operator's feet.

**A WARNING** DO NOT exceed load rating of cable puller, rope or accessories.

**AWARNING** ALWAYS inspect rope before each use.

**A WARNING** ALWAYS disconnect cable puller before servicing.

ALWAYS plug the Model 66 Cable Puller into a grounded receptacle with a 15 amp GFCl protected circuit. DO NOT modify the plug provided with the Model 66 Cable Puller.


**ALWAYS** ensure cable puller is properly secured to conduit and all pins are in place before operating.

Pulling Rope should be the only thing to contact the capstan.

NEVER let swivels, grips, etc. come in contact with the capstan.

A WARNING Rope must ALWAYS be pulled over a <u>rotating</u> sheave. If a sheave does not rotate, turn cable puller off immediately and determine problem before continuing the pull.

Set up the cable puller so that pulling rope ALWAYS contacts both rollers. (See drawing below.)



### IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION continued

- <u>A WARNING</u>
  ONLY use <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" or larger double-braided composite pulling rope, or a pulling rope with a average breaking strength of 26,000 lbs.
- **A WARNING**NEVER allow the rope to slip on a rotating capstan for more than a couple of seconds. The rope will wear in that spot and the rope could break under pressure.
- **A WARNING**Keep all body parts, hair, loose clothing, etc. away from rotating parts and pinch points. Keep hands away from capstan.
- **WARNING**DO NOT allow the rope to overlap on the capstan. If this condition begins to occur, immediately release the tailing force on the rope. If this does not remedy the overlap, stop the puller and run the puller in reverse to unwind the overlap.
- **A WARNING** During the pull, all personnel must stand to the side of the cable puller and out of the direct line of tight pulling rope.
- The cable puller must be attached to steel conduit or schedule 40 PVC conduit only. When attached to PVC conduit, the conduit MUST be supported within 2" of the end.
- ALWAYS inspect pins to be sure they are fully inserted through holes and have spring clips properly attached. DO NOT substitute any other object for factory supplied pins.
- **A WARNING** Keep the area underneath the cable pull clear of all personnel.
- **A WARNING**Keep fingers away from adjustment holes and pivoting parts. Fingers can be severed by pivoting parts.
- **A WARNING**Keep as much rope confined in conduit as possible. This will help prevent injury should the rope break and whip violently.
- **A CAUTION**DO NOT alter this cable puller. Doing so will void the warranty. Guards and safety features are provided for your protection.
- **A CAUTION** Wear eye protection when operating the cable puller.
- **A CAUTION** Inspect all components of the cable puller before beginning any cable pull. Replace any worn or defective components.
- **CAUTION** Be careful during assembly and disassembly of the cable puller. Have control of components before removing any pins.
- **A CAUTION**DO NOT use an extension cord longer than 100 ft. Extension cord should be a minimum of 12 gauge wire with ground.
- **A CAUTION** Some components of the pulling package exceed 50 lbs. and will require more than on person to lift.
- The motor, gear box and capstan may heat up during the pull. Be careful.
- **ALWAYS** pull in the direction of the arrows on top of the capstan.
- Shift speeds ONLY when the capstan is at a stop. DO NOT shift speeds while the capstan is moving.
- **A CAUTION** Before shifting speeds, release the tailing force on the rope to relieve the tension on the capstan and motor gearbox.






### SET-UP AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Model 66 Cable Puller shown pinned for transport on 4 wheel mobile carriage.





1 From the transport position, remove the extension arm locking retainer pin.



2 Remove the puller mount locking retainer pin.




3 With the swivel casters brakes disengaged, lift the motor end of the puller so that the adjustable boom touches the floor.




4 Continue to lift the motor end and pull the carriage until the extension arm is straight. Reinsert the extension arm locking retainer pin to secure the tube, making sure to secure the pin with the attached clip.




5 Raise the boom to a comfortable working height for adjusting the nose unit and insert the puller mount locking retainer pin, making sure to secure the the pin with the attached clip.



**6** Next, to position the adjustable boom to the desired length for the pull, remove the locking retainer pin that goes through the adjustable boom and re-pin at the desired length, making sure to secure the pin with attached clip. **NOTE**: The adjustable boom can be removed and turned for either an up pull or a down pull.




**7** The angle of the nose unit can be adjusted for multiple pulling angles by removing the angle adjustment pin on the adjustable boom. Select the angle needed for the pull and reinsert the pin, making sure to secure the pin with the spring clip.



8 An additional angle adjustment can be made on the nose unit coupling adapter. Remove the angle adjustment pin and adjust the coupling adapter to the desired angle. Re-insert the angle adjustment pin, making sure to secure the pin with the spring clip.



**9** The standard couplings for the model # 66 puller are stored on the puller carriage. Choose the correct size coupling for the conduit you are pulling in and insert into the coupling adapter by pushing the receiver plate of the coupling into the coupling adapter until the spring loaded pawl "snaps" into the receiver plate. See figures 9A through 9C.






**A WARNING** Set up the cable puller so that pulling rope ALWAYS contacts both rollers. (See drawing at left).

11 Next, move the cable puller into position. While maintaining control of the boom, remove the puller mount locking retainer pin that you installed in step #5. Fully insert the coupling into the conduit until the ring of the coupling sits flush on the conduit. If the coupling is not at the correct angle to fully insert



into the conduit, adjust the angle of the coupling adapter or the length of the adjustable boom. Lock the two swivel casters and tighten the coupling thumb screw onto the conduit. Insert the locking retainer pin through the first available hole in the puller mount that is on the boom side of the upright (See figure 9D).

NOTE: ALWAYS ensure the locking retainer pin is NOT inserted into the boom transport hole (see exploded view on page 14) during a pull.








12 The operator may stand on either side of the cable puller. Place the foot switch on the side the operator will be standing. Plug the cord into a 15 amp GFCI protected outlet.



**13** Push the FWD/REV switch to the *forward* position.



14 Depress the foot switch and ensure the rotation of the capstan matches the pulling rotation direction decal on the cable puller.



**15** Next, turn the High/Low speed switch to the desired position, "H" or "L"

NOTE: High speed setting is for lower force pulls. Switch to low speed for higher force pulls or when high speed begins to strain the motor.

**A CAUTION** Shift speeds ONLY when the capstan is at a stop. DO NOT shift speeds while the capstan is moving.



16 To begin the pull, place 2 to 3 wraps of the pulling rope around the capstan in the direction of the pulling rotation direction decal. Depress the foot switch and begin the pull. If the amount of tension (tailing force) you have to put on the pulling rope exceeds approximately 10 lbs., then turn the cable puller off and add one wrap of the pulling rope to the capstan.



17 When the pull is completed, remove the coupling from the coupling adapter by pulling the ring on the back of the coupling adapter.
NOTE: Be sure to loosen the thumb screw if you have tightened it against the conduit.



NOTE: The Model 66 puller can be disassembled from, and used without the 4 wheel carriage. To do so, remove the puller mount pivot pin and lift the puller off of the carriage.



66 puller shown in position for an up pull without the 4 wheel carriage.


### **COMMON SET-UPS**

**A WARNING** NEVER allow the rope to slip on a rotating capstan for more than a couple of seconds. The rope will wear in that spot and the rope could break under pressure.

**A WARNING** Keep fingers away from adjustment mount holes and pivoting parts. Fingers can be severed by pivoting parts.


**A WARNING** DO NOT allow the rope to overlap on the capstan. If this condition begins to occur, immediately release the tailing force on the rope. If this does not remedy the overlap, stop the puller and run the puller in reverse to unwind the overlap.

**A CAUTION** The motor, gear box and capstan may heat up during the pull. Be careful.




### **DISTRUCTIONS**

Failure to follow these lifting instructions could cause property damage, serious injury or death.




Ensure the puller is pinned in the transport position as shown. The puller mount pivot pin should be fully inserted with spring clip attached. The puller mount locking retainer pin should be inserted in the lowest hole of the puller mount with the attached spring clip securely fastened.

2 Using a minimum 6' long nylon sling with minimum choker lifting rating of 1,000 lbs. and eyes on each end, place the sling under the puller mount as shown.



#### LIFTING INSTRUCTIONS continued



Thread one eye of the sling through the other eye and tighten the looped eye until it is snug against the extension arm mounting tube as shown. Use the other eye of the sling to lift the puller, keeping the sling in as straight a line as possible with the vertical carriage frame tube.

#### MAINTENANCE

#### Capstan

Replace the capstan if it is grooved more than 1/16" deep.

#### Gear Box

The Model 66 Cable Puller has a vent-free gear box and is factory lubricated for life with synthetic, semifluid gear lubricant with an operating range of +5°F to +220°F. Therefore, no maintenance is required.


Unplug the cable puller before servicing.


# EXPLODED VIEW — 4 WHEEL CARRIAGE






# EXPLODED VIEW — GEAR ASSEMBLY
